From the Desk of Pastor Andi

August 2023

In the gospel of Matthew, chapter 10 verse 42 Jesus says, “Whoever gives even a cold cup of water to one of these little ones in the name of a disciple—truly I tell you, none of these will lose their reward.” Jesus stresses, in my opinion, the importance of hospitality and meeting the needs before you. If someone is hungry, give them food; thirsty, give them a drink; naked, give them clothes; sick or in prison, visit them (this we find a little later on in Matthew 25).

I think we struggle with this. It is not that we don’t see the value of hospitality or that we are not generous. We have simply been caught up in the ways of this world where things are only given if they are deserved. We don’t want to be generous to those who aren’t trying or those who are in a difficult position because of their own poor choices. I simply don’t see that option given to us in the gospel.

I see our qualifiers in hospitality and generosity all around us. Every year around Christmas the radio station I listen to offers help to families who find themselves in difficult situations ‘through no fault of their own’ (it is said every time the Christmas assistance program is promoted).

Just today I experienced a situation where help will be offered, but it simply *had* to be noted that there were opportunities presented where the assistance should not have been needed.

Many of you know my daughter, Becca, is on a band trip to Europe. Each day I receive a number of goofy texts from her. The last couple of days we have had a check in or two, but not a lot of banter. They have been traveling for 13 days, and that is a long time. I asked how she was, and she simply said, “the food has not been so good the last few days.” Please understand that we are not fans of German inspired food (this is an important piece of information since she has been in Germany and now Austria). After some more questions, she shared that she has had the same dinner 3 days in a row (pork, sauerkraut, and bread dumplings). So, she really hasn’t eaten dinner for 3 days in a row. Breakfast is in the hotel and lunch is what you grab on your own along the way during sightseeing. So, she is now a walking Snickers commercial and is miserable. The hotel does not have food vending machines and she is not able to go out on her own to get food once they are taken to the hotel for the night. I reached out to Dan (her band director at West) and Jana (her piano teacher) Singer, hoping they would know someone on the trip. The Singers came through and one of the chaperones on the trip was going to get Becca a snack. Whew! However, he had to make sure to let Mr. Singer know that he felt there were opportunities for Becca to have lunch and snacks on her own that would have made this help unneeded. This was because his experience as an adult on the trip (who has taken this trip a number of times) and her experience as a student on the trip (her first trip out of the country), were very different. And while they were on the same trip, his experience with food (lasagna and pasta dishes) and hotel accommodations was very different to Becca’s. And so, his perception of the circumstances compelled him to say he would help, but that it shouldn’t have been needed.

This is a generally silly and insignificant example. She is not going to die from missing a couple of meals—though she will be emotional about it. But so often we are unwilling to see things from another perspective. We simply think our experience is everyone's experience. This unwillingness to open our minds to another perspective means that we just leave ministry undone. Being a disciple of Jesus that follows the call of the Spirit rather than the desire of the flesh means that we resist asking all the 'little ones' why they didn't get a drink earlier and just offer the cold cup of water. Do they always deserve that cold cup of water (or any other hospitality needed)? Maybe not. But then again, we are a people reliant upon the grace (undeserved forgiveness) of God. Let us go and do unto others what God in Jesus has done for us. Amen

**** IMPORTANT MESSAGE ****

It is so much easier for me to report numbers when things are going well but it's important that I share the news when things are not where we expect or need them to be. While things are not dire, I want everyone to be aware of our current situation.

As of June 30th, our current financial deficit was (\$26,289) while our available cash was \$15,912. If we continue on our current downward trend, our available funds are anticipated to be depleted within the next few months.

We started January with a positive cash flow and unfortunately, each month since then has reflected negative cashflows.

High inflation and prices of goods and services has placed pressure on each of us. Please prayerfully consider if you are able to help our current financial needs as we move forward; be it through monetary means, sharing your time and talents and/or continuing to pray for us as a congregation.

Some upcoming opportunities for you to get involved with and that will help us to raise funds include the EAA parking of cars, the Pizza Ranch night out and purchasing of RaiseRight (scrip) cards. If you are interested in helping with any of these fundraisers, please contact the church office.

As the Council discusses our situation, we know that we have the upcoming, one-time, larger expense for the sidewalk replacements with the anticipated cost of approximately \$13,000.

We are a blessed congregation and as we have done many times in the past, we will persevere.

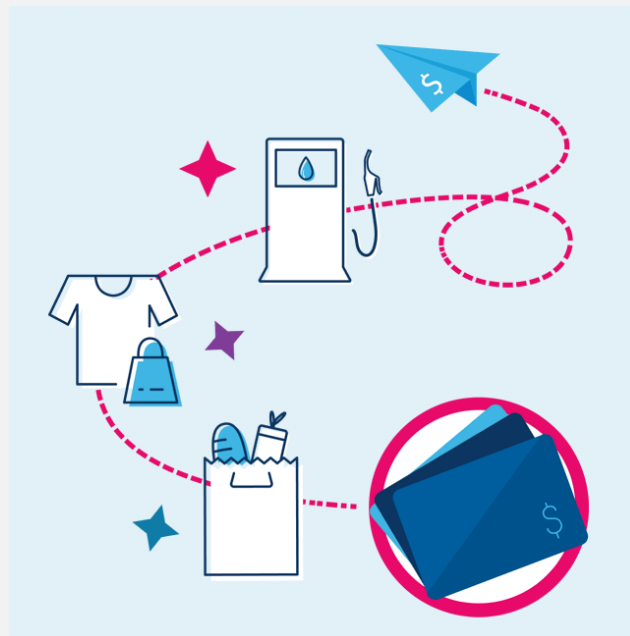

What's happening in the food pantry...



If you happen to shop at Piggly Wiggly on Murdock Avenue, you will see this box by the east entrance. You will have an opportunity to purchase a donation bag for around \$8, after purchase you drop it in this box and it will be picked up by Henry Caron and brought to our food pantry! How great is that?!!! This box was made by Linda Stowe and Ray Hitz, we can't thank them enough for creating such a great display. All donations collected in this box benefit Emmanuel's food pantry. This is an ongoing food collection. So, next time you are at Piggly Wiggly check it out! Thanks **RED'S PIGGLY WIGGLY** for your continued support!

We are seeing an increase in the number of people who are using our pantry. In May we helped 67 families. 145 adults and 129 children were served. 7 families were new to our pantry. In June we helped 84 families. 162 adults and 129 families were served. 13 new families came to our pantry. We are already seeing a greater number coming to our pantry in July. With these numbers increasing, and the government commodities decreasing, we are having to purchase more food. Henry does a great job getting us the bargains and sales that are available. Thank you, **HENRY CARON** for managing the pantry so efficiently!

Church Council Meeting Highlights

June 13, 2023

Meeting called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Leanne. Opening prayer by Pastor Andi.

President's Report: Culver's dining out fundraiser earned \$325. Lower Narthex Bathroom - Toilet Seat will be replaced, Kim and Mike are in the process of replacing everything and Kim asked about putting some form of art up in the bathroom, which the council agreed to. Firehouse Subs had no reply for a fundraiser, but we have a dinner planned at Pizza Ranch for August 14. Blinds - Leanne, Deb and Pastor Andi will work together in a small committee, Leanne got quotes. Revisit in August, the blinds are looking to be more money than originally anticipated.

Secretary's Report: Minor typos in Zach's report alongside the Alliant Energy stocks being incorrect, which have been corrected. Minutes accepted as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: Reviewed May financial reports. We had a negative cash flow of \$11,049.25 with a negative YTD of \$18,920.77. Alliant Energy stock was -\$3.68 (6.67%), this month, with a YTD of -\$3.75 (6.79%). Majority of expenses for the month were Arrow Audio - Switcher, Employees' Pension & Pastor Andi's Health Insurance, WPS and 1st Qtr Fed & SS Taxes. Treasurer's Report accepted.

Pastor's Report: General: I have completed my Anti-Racism Training required by the national church. I did an online learning event on Implicit Bias. The program consisted of three 2-hour Zoom sessions that required about 2 hours of preparation per session. I found the program informative. My final Communities of Practice meeting for the 2022-2023 session is June 13 at 10:00. I met via Zoom with pastors from Green Bay, Kaukauna/Appleton, Sheboygan, Sheboygan Falls, and Sturgeon Bay. This is a professional gathering and participation in a COP group is deeply encouraged by the conference. Being in a professional group helps keep us accountable to a group of our peers. As you are aware, we are functioning without a custodian. This will save us some money in a financially tight time. However, it will require from all of us a bit of our time. A sign-up sheet has been created. We need to encourage people to support the Sunday School program. I continue to think we are doing our kids a disservice by only offering Sunday School twice a month. I would like feedback about having Lay readers during service—like, don't like, whatever...

We will be parking cars for EAA at the end of July. Ron Golliher is the man with a plan, so let him know if you would like to help. Many thanks to Jeff and Mary Ann Bartels for giving us this opportunity. I have had some questions and comments about our alcohol policy as of late. Emmanuel UCC is an alcohol-free facility (except for communion wine.) This is not because we are prohibitionists or have pious beliefs about alcohol consumption. We are alcohol free to afford those who battle issues with alcohol a safe space. Last Month: We have had 2 baptisms since last meeting: Collins Reiter, daughter of Craig and Carley (Winter) Reiter, on May 21 and Eloise Weeks, daughter of Adam and Micalla (Yoder) Weeks, on June 4. I have had 2 funerals since the last meeting, Nate Wilson on May 12, and Marianne Mathe on June 3.

New Business: Sidewalk replacement - We won't know for sure the final cost until the work is done, but our rough estimate is 45 regular squares, 9 driveway and 1 apron for about \$12k-13k. Internal Audit Process - Leanne, Craig, Pastor Andi and Connie are looking at this in another committee. Phone system replacement - we are in the dark, no new information, but will be put on agenda to think about for later.

Good & Welfare: Leanne - Noah isn't sure about being able to attend meetings due to work, but Robin made sure the Trustees know his free time so he can be put to work. Leanne - Concern about security of the building when it's just Lori or Pastor Andi, keep doors locked with a little sign that either instructs them to ring the doorbell or call the office in order to be let in. Leanne - Asks Pastor Andi about all the stuff entered into the projector and who does it, which is Pastor Andi.

Wow! the summer has once again flown by, it truly feels like we just finished the kids' spring sports, and now, their fall sports are starting up.

Our technology committee has been hard at work the last few months, and I would like to provide the congregation an update. This spring we finished upgrading the backbone of our projection equipment from analog to digital. We are now able to utilize the same worship presentation both in the sanctuary as well as for our online viewers. In addition to the new projection equipment, we have also upgraded some of our livestreaming equipment.

Our website provider was also recently bought out, resulting in a transition to the new company. Lisa Smith and I have been working to learn the new system to ensure a seamless transition for viewers of the site.

Over the past year our technology committee started utilizing a website called Sign Up Genius; this website provides the ability to create sign-ups in a simple format and for volunteers to see the dates that are available as well as who has signed up for other dates. As an added bonus, you will automatically receive an e-mail reminder the day before your scheduled sign up. We have had such great success utilizing Sign Up Genius for the projection screen that we are implementing two additional sign ups on this platform:

- Cleaning
 - Due to vacant custodian position, the church council has opted for volunteers to assist in cleaning
 - Multiple tasks are available for daily, weekly, monthly, or quarterly cleaning.
- Liturgist
 - Pastor will email you the details of the scripture lesson(s) by Monday or Tuesday of the week you sign up for.

Scan the QR codes with your smartphone (open your camera, focus on the QR code, and select the link that appears on the screen) to look at the options and sign up to volunteer. Signing up is as simple as selecting an available date, entering your name, and entering your e-mail address. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask.

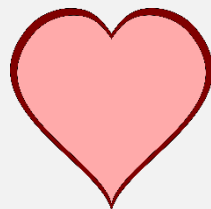
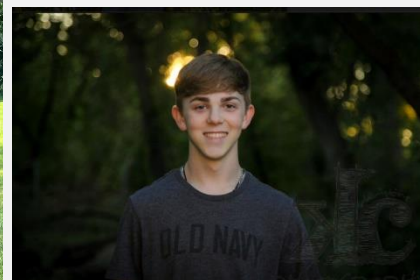
