From the Desk of Pastor Andi

October 2024

I miss salad bars. Remember the days when you got a plate, and you got to pick and choose what you wanted on your salad? You were in control! Don't want onions? Don't take them! Not feeling the tomatoes? No problem—you don't have to put them on there. And I like buffets where you can pick what you want and leave behind what you don't like. You get a clean plate and decide from a variety of options what you are eating today. Pick what you want—leave what you don't want. Go back—or don't. You rule at the buffet!

But as much as I like salad bars and buffets for my meals, I get really frustrated when people take that same approach to faith. We use the bible to justify all sorts of personal beliefs, while at the same time ignoring other parts of scripture that our personal belief don't align with. So, tell me, who told you that the teachings of Jesus were a buffet or a salad bar?

In his letter to the twelve tribes of the dispersion, James reminds us that we are accountable for the whole law. In his second chapter he reminds us of all that it is God who gave the law, and if we break one part, we are accountable for all of it. If we fail to love our neighbor, we have broken not just one commandment, but the commandments as a whole. This is no buffet where we get to pass pick and choose what we follow.

I believe we struggle with this a great deal. The law of God is written on our hearts, so we know when we have acted selfishly or vengefully. But instead of acknowledging our sin and turning to the right path, we double down and justify those sins (or at least try to justify them). We explain all the good we do, and perhaps point out how different the world is today. While we might be able to soothe our guilty conscience, I don't think God is amused.

It would be easier if we could just pick and choose the faith components on our plate, but discipleship is not a buffet. We are expected, no commanded, to put on our plate and follow all those commandments, not just the ones we like. And it would be great if faith was like horseshoes and hand grenades where close counts. In faith, keeping 9 out of the 10 commandments means you broke the 10 commandments.

I'm not getting upset because the law is broken. Honey, I am right there with ya, seeking grace. And while I am not God, I can't help but believe God isn't so much disappointed in our failings as in our complacency with sinning.

We won't be perfect, but we must be repentant. We don't know everything, but we must remain teachable. Imperfect people who keep trying to do better don't bother me. But complacent people who try to convince us all that keeping some of the law is good enough just rub me the wrong way.

We do a pretty good job of loving God with heart, soul, strength, and mind. It's that part about loving our neighbor as ourselves that seems to trip us up. But that is a great big part of being a disciple of Christ. Our world will be changed for the better when we seriously embrace the call to love all our neighbors as much as we love ourselves. When the church tenaciously centers in on that, she will not just survive, she will thrive.

Treasurer's Nook

As we move closer to the last quarter of the year with the anticipation of cooler weather, we are a fortunate congregation that our finances are not trending in the same manner. Our giving has been very generous and our expenses lower than planned, leaving us with a positive monthly cashflow of \$6,351 and a positive year-to-date cashflow of \$20,923. While these numbers are very good news, we do need to remain cognizant of the upcoming sidewalk expense and larger heating expenses as we move closer to the winter months.

Our sidewalk invoice is due by Nov 1 which totals \$12,590.94. As of August 30, we have \$10,290 available leaving us \$2,300.94 to raise. Thank you for all of the support. If you would like to help with this cause, make a note on your donation reflecting 'sidewalk fund' or contact the church office.

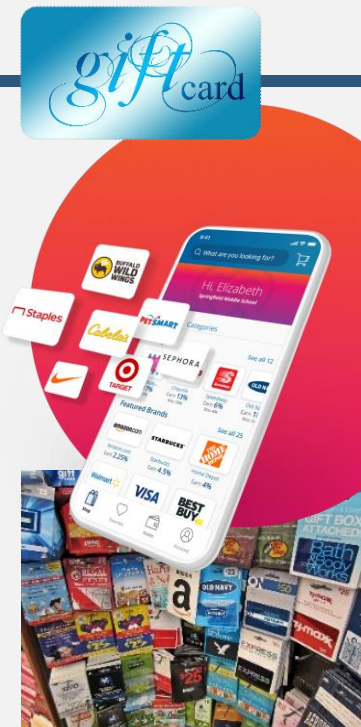

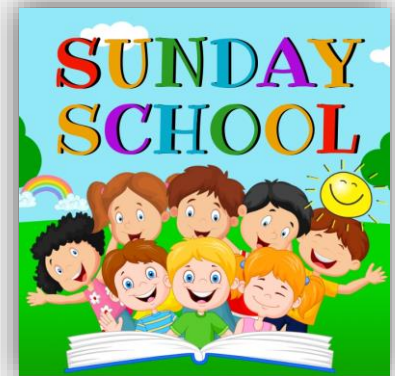
Sunday School Mission Project - Jefferson Elementary Book Drive

Church Council Meeting September 10, 2024

Meeting called to order by Leanne. Opening prayer by Pastor Andi.

President's Report: Blinds for the west side windows are in and correct, the East side blinds are still too short and are being sent in to hopefully be correct the third time. The Pizza Ranch fundraiser felt pretty good, and for the work it is doing it again sounds like a good idea. Ballot is full except for one deacon position still needed. M&E minutes were sent out.

Secretary's Report: Report accepted as printed.

Treasurer's Report: Reviewed August financial reports. We had a positive cash flow of \$6,350.81 with a positive YTD of \$20,923.13. Alliant Energy stock was +\$2.61 (4.69%) this month, with a YTD of +\$6.97 (13.59%). Majority of expenses for the month were Emp Pension & Andi's Health Ins, OCWM, Tom's Custom Blinds, WPS - Gas & Electric, 2024 SS Mission - Operation Not Alone and SS Mission - Sleep in Heavenly Peace. Treasurer's Report accepted as printed.

Pastor's Report: General: Started my Communities of Practice, which is a professional development and accountability group. These groups are highly encouraged by the conference. Mine meets in person in September and May, and virtually October through April. I was contacted last month by First Congregation about providing Pastoral coverage for them until their new pastor arrives in November. This would just be critical hospital visits and funerals. This Month: September 4th was Ron Gorchels funeral, September 8 Rally Day—I believe we had about 28-30 students, so it was a pretty good kick-off for the Christian Education year, September 11 Confirmation meeting with students and parents, September 13 Meeting at Jefferson Elementary, September 15 Baptism—Lainey Sauer, September 22 Baptism—Callie Schumann. For the Future: I hope to do some visitation training with anyone who might even remotely be interested in visiting folks who are homebound or in nursing homes. It would just be a session or two. It is important that lay members begin claiming some of the ministry done here at Emmanuel. It would not lessen my visits, just make sure our shut-ins get more contact. I am looking at fall bible/book studies.

Deacon's Report: Discussed paraments storage--ideas still welcome.

Good & Welfare: discussed budgeting for a custodian for next year's budget. Maybe about 5-8 hours a week, the plan is to have this in the budget whether or not we actually use it just to have the numbers drawn up for it.

Sidewalk Update...

Way back in the early part of 2023 we were informed some of our sidewalk squares would need to be replaced. We watched as they came out and marked a huge amount of squares that would be replaced. We made a rough estimate of \$13,000 for this project. After many months, the bill finally came and our estimate was pretty close—\$12,590.94. Those monies are due November 1. To date, we have raised about \$10,290 leaving us to still raise about \$2300. Thank you for your extravagant generosity—we are almost there!
