Pastor Andi's Message

This time of the year is oftentimes a bit weird for me. I love Christmas, so December is filled with anticipation and then celebration. But then January seems to last about 100 days. February is so cold. And I feel just a little...meh. I am longing for spring and that means I am not appreciating this present moment. I feel, among other things, a little sluggish. Now before you jump to give me advice—I agree. I should probably eat less sugar and more vegetables, drink more water, exercise more, and make sure to get plenty of rest. All those things—yes. But what I think I really need, is...and I can't believe I am even thinking this...Lent.

Sometimes life is so crazy and busy, and we need something to slow us down a bit, and Lent can do that. Sometimes life feels so out of control, and we need discipline and order, and Lent can do that. Sometimes we feel a disconnect and we need to reconnect, and Lent can do that. Sometimes we need a little bit of everything Lent has to offer—prayer, repentance, fasting, and almsgiving. Lent isn't always my favorite season of the year, but sometimes, now in particular, it feels like one of the most important seasons.

This year, as every year, I encourage you to intentionally journey through Lent. 40 days (and 6 Sundays) where we purposefully strengthen our faith through prayer, repentance, fasting and almsgiving.

Prayer—intentional prayer calls us to quiet the noise of this world and sit a while with God. Just as intentionally setting time aside for our kids or spouse or friends strengthens that relationship, setting time aside to pray strengthens the sense of connection we have with our Creator. Pray intentionally.

Repentance—we are not perfect. But we are rather good at overlooking or justifying our own sin. The simple reality is that sin is sin. While we may be able to justify a particular act, that doesn't make it right. If my babies are starving, I can justify stealing food. But again, that doesn't make it right. Intentionally praying allows us to more objectively assess our lives, and more faithfully see our own sin. Repent openly and honestly.

Fasting—this is a more common way of observing Lent; giving something up. But friends, I am not a fan of making life more difficult just for the sake of making life more difficult. If you are going to use this time to give up something that is unhealthy that is one thing. Stop smoking, give up alcohol, adopt a healthy lifestyle. For some, the actual discipline of giving up some simple pleasure is a spiritual exercise. If that is not the case for you, I am going to encourage you to fast by giving up swearing, or being negative, or sharing gossip. Fast from toxic social media, or time-wasting games, or simply being too hard on yourself or your loved ones. Fast in a way that makes you healthier physically, emotionally, and/or spiritually.

Alms-giving—respond to the love and grace you find through prayer, repentance and fasting by being a blessing to others. Give of yourself. Spend intentionally. Make a financial commitment to a particular charity or ministry. Intentionally spend your time sending cards, making calls, or volunteering. Deliberately spend your time with kids or spouse or family. You have been blessed with some amazing gifts, and it is always the right time to use those gifts to bless your household and others.

All of these things; prayer, repentance, fasting, and almsgiving are exactly what my life needs. Let's journey through Lent together—and we will meet at the empty tomb!

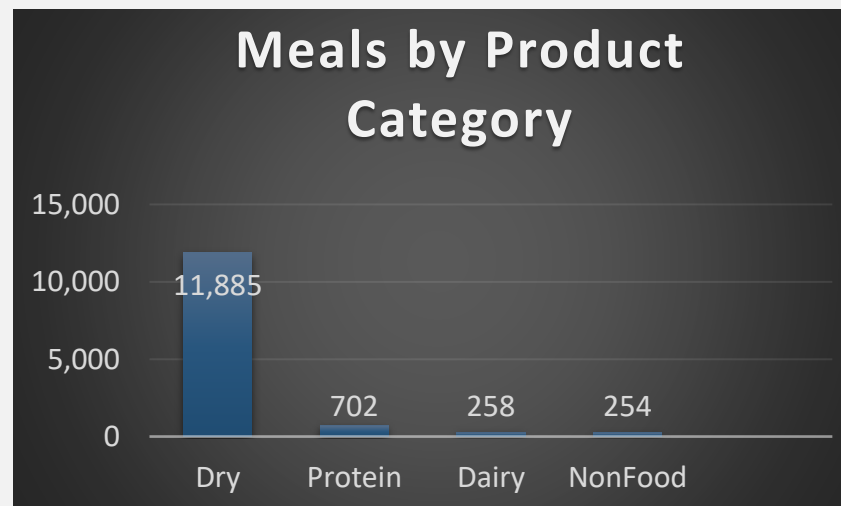

Thank you to everyone who brought in canned pasta meals during the month of February. During the month of January, we are asking for **Soup**. If you see soup on sale, please pick up some extra cans and bring them in for the food pantry.

During the month of January, we served 111 families. 19 families were new to our pantry. 226 adults, and 191 children were served. Thank you for your continued support!

An interesting fact about our food pantry for 2024. Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin is one of our resource centers. We are able to obtain some free non-perishable items as well as purchasing items at a reduced cost. Through the food received we were able to provide 13,209 meals! 10,452 meals (79% of the total) were donated items. 2,757 meals (21% of the total) were items we purchased. Partnering with Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin is how we help fight hunger.

Thank you to **Henry Caron** for working with Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin. Henry checks the availability at Feeding America almost daily as the inventory changes frequently. Henry also shops for bargains on a weekly basis to help keep our shelves full of nutritional food items. We also receive food once a month from the government, however, we have noticed a decrease in the availability of that resource.

 - Gerry said that there was a typo in the endowment allocation in the report, under “Local Church Mission(s)” the “YMCA Scholarship Fund” should be \$500, not \$540.

New Business

- The proposed endowment fund disbursement, with the corrections made by Gerry, was reviewed.

- The M&E Committee had multiple fund allocations that hadn’t been touched in 4+ years. They wanted to dissolve these specific funds to be added to the undesignated fund, pursuant with the M&E Constitution Part 2, Section 6. Those funds were:
 - Carpet (\$10), Table (\$610), Sunday School (\$620), Choir Fund (\$2060), and the UCC/Emmanuel Seminary School (\$7027.80)
 - Motion to accept the dissolution as proposed by the M&E Committee was made by Jim Schaick, seconded by Al Schaick. Motion carried.
- Recognizing Gerry Keuler as retiring from the M&E treasurer, being succeeded by Jeff Stark.
- A motion was made by Laurie Dorst to approve Sherri Annis onto the Memorial and Endowment Committee, seconded by Cory Schultz. Motion carried.
- Leanne brought forth the approval of the 2025 Proposed budget. No questions or concerns were brought forth.
 - Motion to accept the 2025 proposed budget was made by Jeff Stark, seconded by Bev Edwards. Motion carried.
