Somehow, we have made 'complicating' Jesus an art. We put qualifies on his commands, just as the lawyer did when he asked, "And who is my neighbor?" We all know how that turned out for him. Love. It's not complicated.

Am I the only one who has ever been in the midst of a heated 'discussion' with someone (perhaps one of your children) who has done this? Somewhere along the line you begin to realize that they DO understand what you are saying. 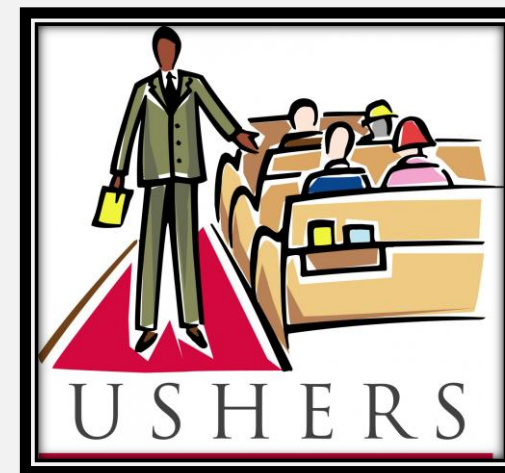

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Food Pantry Update...

We could always use more help in the pantry. With our additional shift added, the 1st, 2nd & 4th Wednesdays between 3-5pm, we could use some help answering the phones from 3:00pm until 4:30pm. If this is something you think you would like to try, please give us a call. We could also use help answering the phones between 8:00am and 9:30am on Friday mornings. If you can only work one day here or there, that would be helpful. We can put you on a rotation. Please prayerfully consider helping us in the pantry.

During the month of July, we served 86 families. 173 adults and 103 children were served. 5 families were new to our pantry. We distributed approximately 9030 pounds of food! Our government commodities have been cut way back so we are finding it necessary to purchase groceries.

Henry is always looking for bargains to purchase what is needed to fill the bags with non-perishable food items. Our resource center as well as TFAP don't always have the items that we need. Could you please help us out by purchasing **Cereal, Rice & Mac & Cheese** when you are at the grocery store? These donations would really help fill the bags!

Family Idea for the Month:

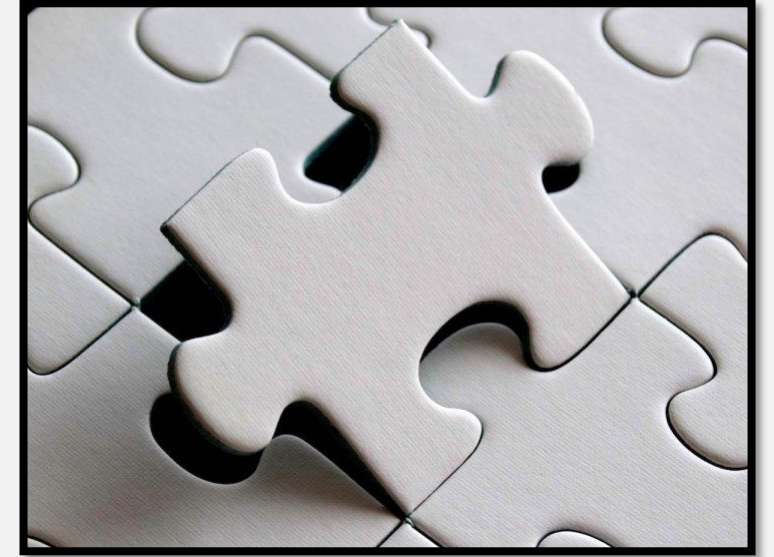

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Church Council Meeting Highlights

August 12, 2025

Meeting called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Leanne. Opening prayer by Pastor Andi.

President's Report: Fundraiser updates--EAA Parking raised \$19754 EUCC.

Children's Parade—had a few people walk the parade and a number of people visit our table. Those there felt it went well. Thanks to Emily Reyes for organizing our participation and Craig for getting the banner and frisbees.

Secretary's Report: June minutes were accepted as printed.

Treasurer's Report: Reviewed June financial reports. We had a negative cash flow of (\$757.74) with a negative YTD of (\$10,182.95.) the majority of expenses for the month were Pastor's Health and Pension, Fed & SS Payroll Taxes, and WPS-Gas and Electric. Reviewed July financial reports. We had a positive cash flow of \$11,724.81 with a positive YTD of \$1541.86. Majority of expenses for the month were Pastor's Health and Pension, GuideOne Insurance, Fed & SS Payroll Taxes, WPS-Gas and Electric and Bartels' portion of the parking revenue. The June and July Treasurer's Reports were accepted as printed.

Pastor's Report: I officiated at Mark Neitzel's funeral on June 20 and Patricia Hoehne's funeral June 21. Mary's anniversary celebration on June 29 went well. Lori did a lot of work to ensure its success. July 15 I started a monthly Bible Study. August 3 we had a High School Youth Group and discussed the birthday cakes given out by the food pantry. August 7 I attended my regular clergy group meeting. The Lay Visitation Ministry Team kicked off August 10. Connie Whittaker is the coordinator, and I believe that will greatly increase its success. August 12 I co-officiated at Ellen Bruce's funeral. In the next few weeks, I will be meeting with Emily Reyes about Rally Day, which is September 14, and we will start confirmation class September 10. I would like to take vacation August 20-27. Tom Fritz has agreed to provide pulpit supply.

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Church Council Meeting Minutes

Deacon's Report: Discussion about why we light the sanctuary candles the way we do.

Trustee's Report: Craig will spray for weeds and spiders. Tom will deal with the ceiling fan that wobbles.

Tuckpointing and the Labyrinth crosses are still being discussed. The seven windows in the lower narthex need to be replaced. Council voted to place them on the Wish List. Discussed painting and anchoring the car bumpers in parking lot. Leanne inquired about where the snow blower was. Jim informed her it was in the paint and tool room in the basement. Since it is battery operated, it is safe to be stored inside.

New Business: Herald ad will not be renewed. Ann Stark wanted to donate a number of books and council voted to accept that donation. Looking ahead to possible fundraisers—we hope Pizza Ranch will be in Jan or Feb 2026. We will try to get a date for Red Robin in late September. We will order candy bars soon.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting is on September 9, 2025, at 6:30 p.m.
