In the book of Acts, we find Paul starting a new church in Corinth, one of the most influential cities in the Roman world. Because of its location on a narrow isthmus between the Corinthian Gulf and the Aegean Sea, it was an important center for commerce and transportation throughout the Mediterranean region. Paul started his evangelism in Corinth by preaching in the synagogue (where he faced a lot of resistance) and then changed his focus to non-Jews, or Gentiles. There he found more success. Paul stayed with this new church for about a year and a half, teaching God's word to these new believers.

Because of the differences in their background, (some Gentile and some Jew), divisions arose in the church in Corinth. These issues—disunity, immorality, bad doctrine, and false teaching—threatened to tear the church apart.

Paul wrote letters to the church in Corinth as a response to these challenges they were facing. He provided guidance and support to the Corinthians as they navigated their faith and community.

While, the city of Corinth is some 5400 miles away, and Paul's letters were written sometimes around 56AD, the core issues remain relevant for today. No, we aren't fighting about speaking in tongues, or whether to eat food that had been sacrificed to idols, but we still allow disunity to destroy us.

Differences of opinion will always be a part of our society and our churches. Conflict is a natural part of being in a relationship. If we are always agreeing, that simply means one person or party doesn't feel safe voicing their true opinion.

Paul didn't write to the church in Corinth to tell them not to disagree, but to disagree as people guided by love. In first Corinthians 13, Paul tells us that if we have the words of angels, but don't share those words through love, we're just a clanging gong or a clashing symbol. If we are true prophets who know everything and have complete faith, but don't have love, we are really nothing. If we give away everything we have so we can feel good about what we've done, but don't have love, we receive no benefit. Love makes all the difference.

We live in a world that no longer seems to value love. And like the church in Corinth, the church of today is tasked with showing the nation and the world how we live united while disagreeing. And the secret to it all is love.

Love is patient and kind. It isn't jealous, it doesn't brag, it isn't arrogant, and it isn't rude. It doesn't demand things always go its way. It isn't irritable and it doesn't keep a record of complaints. It isn't happy with injustice but is happy with the truth.

And that, my friends, is why we find ourselves in such deep turmoil and chaos. We have forgotten that to follow Christ, means being a people of love. When we live in love and disagree, we cultivate a culture of respect where all can thrive. When love is absent one side always seeks to choke out the other, so it eventually dies away.

At the end of the day, you might just be right. But if you haven't shared your truth in love (and with love) it is just noise. And it doesn't really matter. Love makes all the difference!

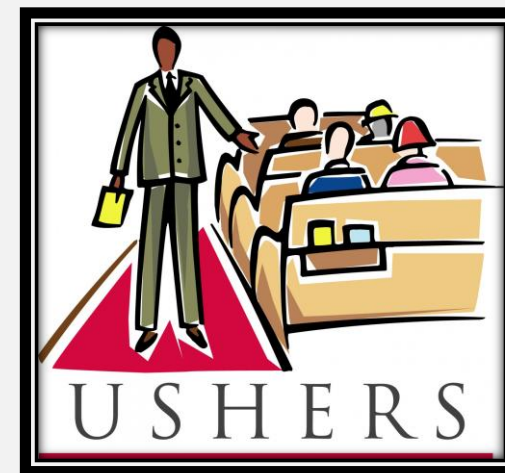

Church Council Meeting Minutes. October 14, 2025

Meeting called to order by Leanne. Opening prayer by Pastor Andi.

President's Report: Red Robin fundraiser ended up earning \$273.18, but we're still waiting to receive the check. Book nook donation of \$80. Jim has installed Mary's and Ron Gorchels's memorial brick.

Secretary's Report: Minutes accepted as printed.

Treasurer's Report: Reviewed September financial reports. We had a negative cash flow of -\$3,888.08 with a negative YTD of -\$8,378.11. Alliant Energy stock was up \$2.34/share from August. Majority of expenses for the month were Payroll taxes for 3rd quarter, WPS and Andi's Health Ins & pension.

Wisconsin Conference UCC asked for OCWM donation of \$18500 for budget proposal, same as last year. Treasurer's Report accepted as printed.

Pastor's Report: General: Funeral at the church September 13. The luncheon was catered by Rodney's and I was asked by the caterer if they could use the stove and I told them they could not use the stove, oven or dishwasher. I was later informed that they figured out how to turn on the gas and used the stove. I called and informed them they would no longer be welcome to cater in our facility. I will send a letter and inform the local funeral homes. I will be having my regular Communities of Practice meeting each month through June, as well as my monthly clergy meetings.

Last Month: Rally Sunday on September 14 went well. The attendance goes up and down. I think having class only 2 weeks a month makes it harder to find a rhythm—especially where there are 5 Sundays in a month. I had a funeral September 19 for Jeff Nicolaison and October 3 for Sandra Ewald. I officiated at the wedding of Lance and Cassie (Zlabek) Yoder October 1.

This Month: I am officiating at the wedding of Tammy Ellis and Bob Nienhaus on October 18. Soup2Go pick-up is October 26. Trunks for Treats will be October 26.

For the Future: Our All Saints service will be November 2. Right now we have Lynda Mohr and Lee Burton. Lynda should have been a part of last year's service but was omitted. Sr. High Youth group will meet Nov. 2 at 5:00pm. Looking ahead, the Madrigal Singers are tentatively scheduled for December 14. That is also the Sunday School program date. I am requesting vacation the week of November 10. Tom Fritz will be preaching.
